The Stages of Human Life

There are many terms for the stages of human development: zygote, blastocyst, embryo, fetus, infant, toddler, child, adolescent, youth, minor, adult, senior, and more. These various stages of human life have different needs and characteristics, but all are human.

The zygote is the one cell stage after the sperm has united with the egg. The egg has 23 chromosomes as does the sperm. The zygote has 46, the complete number of human chromosomes.
